Our team is composed of people from various regions of the country, and we aim to racialize discussions on topics such as the use of technologies in the legal system, such as – but not limited to – public and private surveillance, data protection policies, identification biometrics, internet security, mobile apps, and social media.

We seek to understand through a qualified legal and multidisciplinary perspective, oriented towards communication, ICTs, and related areas, the intersections between technology and race, unveiling the pitfalls of racism as structuring the relations of knowledge and power in Brazil.



It also promotes studies and recommends procedures for Internet security and proposes a research development programs that enable the maintenance of the level technical quality and innovation in the use of the Internet.

What is CDR? The Rights in the Network Coalition is a network of entities that includes more than 48 academic and civil society organization in defense of digital rights, having as the areas of action: access, freedom of expression, protection of personal data and privacy on the Internet. In 2021, AqualtuneLab joined the Rights in the Network Coalition in the networks. We are in the WG of Privacy and Surveillance, LGPD, Freedom of of Expression and Communication.

// Training Courses

One of the pillars of Aqualtune Lab is to work in anti-racist education and integrate knowledge from the areas of law and technology.

We seek to stimulate the process of awareness and dialogue with the Brazilian society, promoting reflections about epistemicide, i.e., regarding racist sabotages to annihilate the conditions of being, producing, enunciating

and articulating knowledge through the perspective and narrative of black people.

Demystifying the two areas of knowledge, as well training professionals from various areas to identify racist behaviors on the Internet and to have tools and knowledge to combat any kind of discrimination in network environments.

In 2021 we offered a class in the Advocacy course and two classes in the Anti-Racist training course, delivered by professionals with extensive knowledge.



// Performances; participations in the legislature

In 2021 we operate in the social sphere, with participation in a bill of the State of Rio de Janeiro and in the signing of the Open Letter to the City of Recife for banning the use of facial recognition technologies.

The Collective Aqualtune Lab was one of the proponents of the document that provides for restrictions on the use of digital technologies by the Brazilian states police, filed on 08.12.2021 in the Legislative Assembly of the State of Rio de Janeiro by the State Representative Dani Monteiro.

Pablo Nunes, our executive director, was one of the proponents of the Bill on the use of people's data and policies on how to treat information captured by companies and public institutions in Rio de Janeiro.

In this sense, the proposal brings the meaning of important expressions to better understand the context that involves the use of facial recognition

Brazil is the 5th country in the world that most uses the devices of the two largest manufacturers of surveillance cameras, according to VPN research. Despite occupying the first positions in the ranking of consumption of these products, the country does not present legal maturity for the use of these technologies, including public policies that guarantee the fundamental rights of Brazilians.

Recently in a statement, the Collective Rights in Networks Coalition issued a warning against the regularization of Artificial Intelligence in Brazil, pointing out that "[...] these systems use big data to solve problems and serve as the basis for automated decisions that can lead to discrimination, for example, racial, gender, or sexual orientation."


In Recife, the city government has announced its intention to install 108 clocks in public spaces. This equipment has facial recognition cameras and would be installed throughout the city after public consultation. Aqualtune Lab and several Civil Society Organizations have warned the city government in an Open Letter about the social impacts of the compulsory mapping of citizens' faces.

Pablo Nunes, Executive Director of Aqualtune Lab and Coordinator of Panoptica, received the honorable mention in the category Personality of the Year in the Defense of Personal Data Protection.

The Article 50 Award from Data Privacy Brazil (premioartigo50. dataprivacy.com.br) aims to recognize and reward individuals and teams who have undertaken initiatives that contribute to the development and implementation of a culture of data protection culture in Brazil.

The award had 38 entries, totaling 115 entries. The winners of all categories were revealed on the night of the Prêmio Artigo 50, which took place on Wednesday (12/15/2021). The ceremony included a presentation by the directors of Data Privacy Brazil and the participation of representatives of the award's Judging Committee.The Personality of the Year in the Defense of Data Protection was the Supreme Federal Court Justice Rosa Weber, rapporteur of the "IBGE case", in which the court decided for the recognition of an autonomous fundamental right to personal data protection. In this category, an honorable mention was also given to Pablo Nunes, executive director of AqualtuneLab, a legal collective based on the study and preparation of proposals that include the analysis of the interrelations between Law, Technology, and Race. He is also a deputy coordinator of CESeC - Centro de Etudos de Segurança e Cidadania. Pablo develops fundamental work in the areas of technology, data protection, and public security.

4. Forecast 2022

Aquilombar

1. Noun derived from the verb aquilombar (neologism). To gather in a quilombo.

2. Brazil, History. Quilombo was the word used to name the places where enslaved blacks gathered when they escaped, organizing a community according to their own culture and customs. Originating from one of the African languages (research sources point out Bantu, Quimbundo, or Umbundo), it meant to camp in the bush.

According to the Michaelis Dictionary: "In the colonial period, a fortified community formed by fugitive blacks and a white and indigenous minority, politically organized, representing a form of resistance and combat against slavery."

4. Currently the noun aquilombamento is used to designate the act or effect of organizing and politically resisting, building spaces to propose reflections and concrete actions about reality, fighting the historical oppression suffered by the black population. According to Joselicio Junior (in free translation from an excerpt of a text published in the Forum Magazine website, https://revistaforum.com.br/opiniao/2019/4/29/tempo-de-se-aquilombar-55485.html): "Aquilombamento is a historical necessity, it is a call, a reconnection with our ancestry to act in the present, it is to build hope, it is to build strength, it is to build a dream, it is to build a better future!"

- produce more reference content for publication on the website and networks
- increase the reach of social networks and access to the site
- create press relations networks to disseminate our actions
- promote the debate on good anti-racist practices in the ICT environment be a reference organization on issues of racism in ICTs
- Advocacy for racial equity in Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) in the public and private sectors
- Produce materials to denounce racist practices in ICTs
